**BEING SEISED** of a Motion in Support of the first Motion, filed by Defence Counsel for the Accused Alex Tamba Brima on 4 March 2005 (“the second Motion”);

**HAVING HEARD** the Parties in open Court on 16 March 2005;


**NOTING** the Combined Prosecution Response to the first and second Motion, filed on 7 March 2005 in which the Prosecution declares that it will disclose a record of payments made to its witnesses prior to the evidence in chief of each witness pursuant to Rule 68 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and it will endeavour to reach an agreement with Defence Counsel for the Accused as to the timing of such disclosure;


