- 1. Ca 29 July 2008 the Defence for the Third Accused, Augustine Gbao, filed its final trial brief. The Gbao Defence filed a corrigendum on 31 July 2008.
- The Defence for the Third Accused noticed that the pagination in the table of contents was not accurate. It therefore files a corrected table of contents in Annex A of the present filing.
- 1. Laddition, the sentence of the paragraph on page 229 was unfinished. The paragraph should have read:
 - Tikewise, the Third Accused submits that there is no evidence allowing for a finding of Augustine Gbao planning, instigating, ordering or aiding and abetting any of these crimes. There is no nexus—whether direct or indirect—between Augustine Gbao and the crimes allegedly committed. Similarly, there is no evidence of Augustine Gbao's participation in there, and less so of a substantial participation.'
- onother paragraph should have followed, reading as follow:
 - Lastly, should the Trial Chamber find that such crimes were committed within or as a reasonable consequence of a Joint Criminal Enterprise, it has been demonstrated that there is no evidence of Augustine Gbao acting in concert with the alleged members of the JCE nor did the Prosecution provide credible evidence of his participation to the furtherance of the alleged common purpose. As a result, he cannot be found responsible for the commissions of the crimes alleged under counts 3-5 as a participant of a JCE.'
- The Defence for the Third Accused apologize for any inconvenience caused to any of the parties.
