DECISION ON URGENT REQUEST TO FILE A MOTION IN EXCESS OF TEN PAGES

BEING SEISED of the "Urgent Request to File a Motion in Excess of Ten Pages," filed by Defence counsel for Issa Hassan Sesay ("Defence") on 19 June 2009 (the "Motion") in which the Defence requests leave to file an unspecified number of additional pages in a motion to be filed pursuant to Rule 115, and states that it anticipates that the motion "will not exceed twenty pages";

NOTING that the Prosecution has not filed a response, and communicated orally to the Senior Legal Officer of the Appeals Chamber that it does not intend to do so;

NOTING that Rule 109(B)(i) provides that the Pre-Hearing Judge "shall take any measures related to procedural matters, including the issuing of decisions, orders and directions with a view to preparing the ease for a fair and expeditious hearing";

NOTING that Rule 115 permits a party to apply by motion to the Pre-Hearing Judge to present before the Appeals Chamber additional evidence which was not available to it at the trial;

CONSIDERING that I am properly seised of the Motion because it is procedural in nature and pertains to a filing that will be made before me as the Pre-Hearing Judge;

CONSIDERING that Article 6(B)(i) of the Practice Direction on Filing Documents before the Special Court for Sierra Leone, as amended 10 June 2005, provides that motions "shall not exceed 10 pages or 3,000 words, whichever is greater";

RECALLING that, pursuant to Article 6(G) of the Practice Direction, an extension of the page limits prescribed in Article 6(B)(i) of the Practice Direction may be granted if the moving Party demonstrates exceptional circumstances that necessitate the oversized filing;

CONSIDERING that the Defence submits that in its motion pursuant to Rule 115 it will advance arguments regarding additional evidence related to five witnesses and that the submissions related to each witness could each constitute a separate motion;

CONSIDERING that in this case the judicial economy of allowing the Defence to submit a single motion rather than filing several separate but related motions constitutes circumstances warranting leave to file additional pages;

HEREBY GRANT the Motion in part, and **ORDER** that the Defence may file a motion pursuant to Rule 115 not to exceed twenty (20) pages.
