IMPORTATION OF TEXTILES (QUOTAS) RULES

Rules.
9 of 1936.

made by the Governor in Council under section 12.

1. These rules may be cited as the Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Rules. Citation.

2. The form of return and declaration to be used under section 4 of the Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Ordinance shall be the combination of Forms A and C in the Appendix to the Third Schedule to the Customs Tariff Ordinance. Forms for section 4.

3. The form of return and declaration to be used in the case of piece goods containing 50 per cent. or more of cotton or of artificial silk or of cotton and artificial silk combined imported from the United Kingdom or from Hong Kong shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule to these rules. The said form shall bear on it the endorsement of the Federation of British Industries or of one of the Chambers of Commerce specified in the Second Schedule or of the Superintendent of Imports and Exports, Hong Kong: Forms for goods from United Kingdom or Hong Kong.

Provided that in the case of consignments of piece goods not exceeding five pounds in value the form of return and declaration may be in the form set out in the Third Schedule. Such form shall not require endorsement in the manner specified above but shall be stamped with the stamp of the Federation of British Industries or of one of the said Chambers of Commerce or of Superintendent of Imports and Exports, Hong Kong.

4. The fees set out in the Fourth Schedule shall be paid in respect of the matters therein specified. Fees.

5. An endorsement made in pursuance of section 7 (6) of the Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Ordinance shall specify the quantity of regulated textiles imported, and the date of import, and shall be signed by the Comptroller or a Chief Officer of Customs. Endorsement of licence.
